



# **Dinosaur Do Over?**


Common Core: Writing Anchor Standard 1: Write opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with reasons.

# Which door?


Which door would you most like to step through? Why? What happens when you step through that door? Either **explain** your choice or **tell a story** about what happens after you step through the door.


